



HUMAN SERVICES

PROGRAM OVERVIEW

40 weeks of instruction, beginning in September and ending in June each year.

This program is designed to produce graduates who can function as facilitators and “front-line” workers in the delivery of human services. Graduates will be able to prepare and implement developmental programs and supports in a variety of service settings.

Students receive a thorough orientation to the field of human services, as well as academic instruction in a variety of topics including human development, human relations, written communication, social role valorization, life style planning, psychology, family support, program planning and support, and more. Theory is applied to field placements involving the community and individuals, from infants to the elderly, with a variety of challenges.

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

- High School Graduation Diploma, **or** Adult High School Diploma, or GED Diploma of High School equivalency

- Proof of a satisfactory physical examination and immunization prior to commencement of training by following instructions on the standardized New Brunswick Community College Medical Form.
 - Proof of criminal record check, using the Canadian Police Computerized Information Systems
 - Three letters of reference

EMPLOYMENT OPPORTUNITIES

Graduates of this program may be employed with family services, early intervention programs, mental health centers, developmental pre-schools, residential services, vocational employment programs, public schools, government agencies and programs, and family support and health services. Prospects for advancement exist in supervisory and management positions within these areas of employment.
