# Motorcycle Repair

40 weeks of instruction, beginning in September each year.

## PROGRAM OVERVIEW

This program recognizes industry's demands for qualified technicians to service today's increasingly sophisticated equipment. Students in the program will develop the entry level skills required to service and repair motorcycles, all terrain vehicles and other related equipment sold and serviced by dealers, such as snowmobiles, lawn and garden machinery and marine equipment.

Training is aimed at an exposure to a variety of skills, enabling the graduate to successfully carry out the basic functions of a Motorcycle Mechanic and Small Equipment Mechanic.

Employment for graduates of this program consistently exceeds 95%.

## EMPLOYMENT OPPORTUNITIES

Graduates of the program may be employed in dealerships, retail sales and service, or self-employed in the service and repair of motorcycles, all terrain vehicles and snowmobiles.

Motorcycle Mechanic is a designated occupation in New Brunswick.
