

## Temporary Resident Visa (TRV) Applications for a current student: Online Eligibility Questions

When you begin your application for a **temporary resident visa from inside Canada**, you will need to:

1. Log into or create an [online IRCC account](#).
2. Go to *Start an Application*, then select *Apply to come to Canada*.
3. Click on the blue button that says Visitor visa, study and/or work permit.
4. Respond to a series of “Eligibility Questions” so that the system can identify what type of application you need to submit. The below list is a guide to some of the appropriate answers for the eligibility questions. Please note that this is not a complete list and you should answer all questions as is accurate in your particular circumstances, if they differ from the recommendation below.

Questions	Answers
<b>What would you like to do in Canada?</b>	Study
<b>How long are you planning to stay in Canada?</b>	Temporarily – more than 6 months
<b>What is your current country/territory of residence?</b>	Canada ( <i>if you are currently inside Canada</i> )
<b>Do you have a provincial attestation letter?</b>	No. This is not a requirement for a temporary resident visa application.
<b>Do you qualify for an exception?</b>	Yes. This is in reference to exceptions to the requirement for the provincial attestation letter.
<b>Which exception do you qualify for?</b>	I am an applicant who meets another exception listed on the IRCC website ( <a href="#">Study permit: Get the right documents Provincial attestation letter or territorial attestation letter - Canada.ca</a> ).
<b>What is your current immigration status in Canada?</b>	Student ( <i>if your study permit is still valid; if it is not currently valid, contact <a href="mailto:international@nbcc.ca">international@nbcc.ca</a> for guidance on your restoration application</i> )
<b>What is your province of destination?</b>	New Brunswick
<b>Select Temporary Resident Visa when prompted</b>	
<b>Which of the following best describes your situation?</b>	I have a study permit for a specific Institution or level of education OR I have a study permit, <i>depending on the information on your study permit</i> .
<b>Have you had a <a href="#">medical exam</a> performed by an IRCC authorized panel physician (doctor) within the last 12 months?</b>	Yes or No, <i>depending on your situation. If yes, you will be prompted to submit a confirmation of the medical examination.</i>
<b>A medical exam is needed before you submit your application for foreign nationals who: Want to stay in Canada for more than 6 months and have lived in one or more <a href="#">designated country or territory</a> for more than six months in the past year or;</b>	Yes or No, <i>depending on your situation. If you have lived in a country for more than 6 months in the last year and that country is considered a <a href="#">designated country</a> then you must answer yes and may be required to complete a medical exam.</i>
<b>Intend to work in one of the following jobs:</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• health sciences worker</li> <li>• clinical laboratory worker</li> </ul>	Yes or No, <i>depending on your situation. If you do intend to work in one of the jobs listed then you must answer yes and may be required to complete a medical exam.</i>

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• patient attendant in nursing or geriatric homes</li> <li>• medical student admitted to Canada to attend university</li> <li>• medical elective and physician on short term assignment</li> <li>• teacher of primary or secondary schools or other teachers of small children</li> <li>• domestics worker, someone who gives in-home care to children, the elderly and the disabled</li> <li>• day nursery worker</li> </ul>	
<p>Do you want to submit an application for a <a href="#">family member</a>?</p>	<p>Yes or No, depending on your situation. Review the definition of <a href="#">family members</a> and note that you can only submit an application here for a family member that is currently inside Canada.</p>
<p>Are you giving someone access to your application?</p>	<p>No (unless you have hired an immigration professional to submit your application for you)</p>
<p>In the past 10 years, have you given your fingerprints and photo (biometrics) for an application to come to Canada?</p>	<p>Yes or No, depending on your situation. If no, you may be required to submit them.</p>
<p>There are fees associated with this application. Will you be paying your fees or are you fee exempt?</p>	<p>Yes, I will be paying my application fees. There are very few exemptions from paying these fees.</p>
